Zines (pronounced Z-E-E-N) are a type of independent & self-published media!

For something to be considered a zine it is usually...

...photocopied...

...made for love, not profit...

...about specific and niche topics...

... & made by people who want to share their something with the world!



Zine Genres*

Zines don't have traditional genres like books do!

But they can be loosely grouped by common themes, aesthetic and ideas!

Some zines are made to share personal stories and thoughts. These types of zines are called perzines! They're like analogue blogs and are written in a diary-esque style.

If you are a fan of something and make a zine about it, you will have created a fanzine! They're a great way to find people who have the same interests as you!

We think that all zines are artbut some zines specifically feature artwork, like drawing or photogrpahy, created by the zinester.

The zine community is a friendly place full of people who LOVE zines. It's quite common for zinesters to team up and create a zine together!

How to fold an 8-page mini zine



An 8-page mini zine is made using a single sheet of paper! There's no stapling needed which makes this one of the most popular zine formats.

Unfold this zine to reveal a blank8-page template, and follow these instructions to make more! You can event experiment Starting off with different paper Sizes!



STEP SIX

Undo the last

fold.

STEP ONE

Get an A4 sheet of paper.



STEP TWO

Fold in half lengthways - like a hot dog!



STEP THREE



STEP FOUR

Fold paper in half the opposite way - like a hamburger!



STEP TEN

Hold on to the edges of paper and push towards the center.



STEP FIVE

Fold in half again in the same direction.



STEP ELEVEN

Flatten down all the pages.



You have now folded an 8-page mini zine!

STEP SEVEN From the folded

edge cut along the center crease to the middle!



STEP EIGHT


Fully unfold the paper.




STEP NINE

Fold in half lengthways again! (Remember it's like a hot dog!)





Photocopying your zine



The most common way to copy your zine is using a photocopier.

You can photocopy your zines at your local library, Officeworks or possibly Sticky Institute if you live in Melbourne.



Getting your zine out into the world!




You can distribute your zines by giving them to friends and family!
